1. What was your main goal in signing up to the Actsmart Business Recycling Program?

To reduce landfill waste by educating staff about recycling.

1. What was your main goal in signing up to the Actsmart Business Energy & Water program?

To increase efficiency and decrease energy (electrical) consumption.

2. Have you seen a saving in your energy or water costs since implementing some/all of identified opportunities?

The change to LED lights has led to an estimated decrease in our electricity bill in the last couple of months. Savings amounted to roughly \$150 per month (after implementation of change in lights as well as switching off unused appliances).

3. What, if any, have been the major challenges you have faced?

The entire process was seamless. The rebate scheme was both accessible and prompt. The rebate claim process was also simple and straight forward.

4. What is the biggest benefit in being part of the Actsmart Business Energy and Water program?

Definitely the incentives. We were planning to upgrade a few items as energy prices were steadily increasing but were deterred by the costs. The energy program allowed us to implement these changes.

5. Would you recommend the program to other small businesses around the ACT?

Most definitely!
